Also when a change-over has been PRIMARY CAUSE: made from one tank to another on the ground Forced landing, due to "Failure impress the necessity of testing an engine at full on the part of the pupil pilot power, at the same time watching the fuel to centre his fuel cock selector handle on another tank after ACTION TAKEN: pressure gauge."
