A/C came down to a height of 300' to ensure that the drogue would drop on the Fighter Squadron Base and not be blown down on the field. The fish on drogue struck Anson which was parked in front of Drogue hangar.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Existing regulations covering height at which drogues should be dropped be adhered to.
