(887) by carburettor icings A/c missing on night navigation & transportation flight for reasons not definitely disclosed, but SECONDARY CAUSE OR CONTRIBUTING FACTORS: probably due to icing conditions causing engine failure, or under conditions of snow, ice & poor visibility became lost & fuel supply ran out.
