PURPOSE OF FLIGHT:

Flying A/C from field where forced landing had been made.

NATURE OF ACCIDENT:

While flying A/C out of field obstructed at end of takeoff by Houses, trees and telephone wires, failed to clear these obstructions.

FINDINGS:

SUMMARY No. 1012

The field was about 150 feet long, a bit rough but hard. The a/c was placed at the leeward end of the field and take-off commenced from there. The a/c became airborne one third of the way down the field at 15 or 20 feet, and the wheels were retracted. It went a short distance, then lost altitude and crashed into trees on the west side of a street which parallels the windward side of the field. An error of judgment on the part of the pilot in that he attempted to take off in too short a field and consequently stalled.
