CONCLUSION OF A.I.B. Agree with findings. Note 1: The I.O. reported that airman standing guard over crash permitted curious civilans to approach cluse enough to wreckage to disturb it and he recommended CLASSIFICATION: that this fact be drawn to Unit's attention. NOTE 2: The I.O. noted a striking similarity between this accident and one on 10-9-43 involving HARVARD FS664 of same Unit which occurred in same place.
