Cause: "Obscure, but the possibility cannot be overlooked of confusion due to misunderstanding as to who was in control of the a/c this possibly resulting first, in neither occupant having control, and second)

Instructor showed poor airmanship and leadership in failing to question his pupil as to control of a/c, and in failing to try use of engine and other flying controls in effort to change altitude of a/c and thus possibly by dislodging the obstruction, overcome jammin;

Agree. Rudder may have jammed as stated by instructor

of rudder control. Consideration might be given to transferring this instructor to other duties." CONCLUSIONS OF A.I.B.
