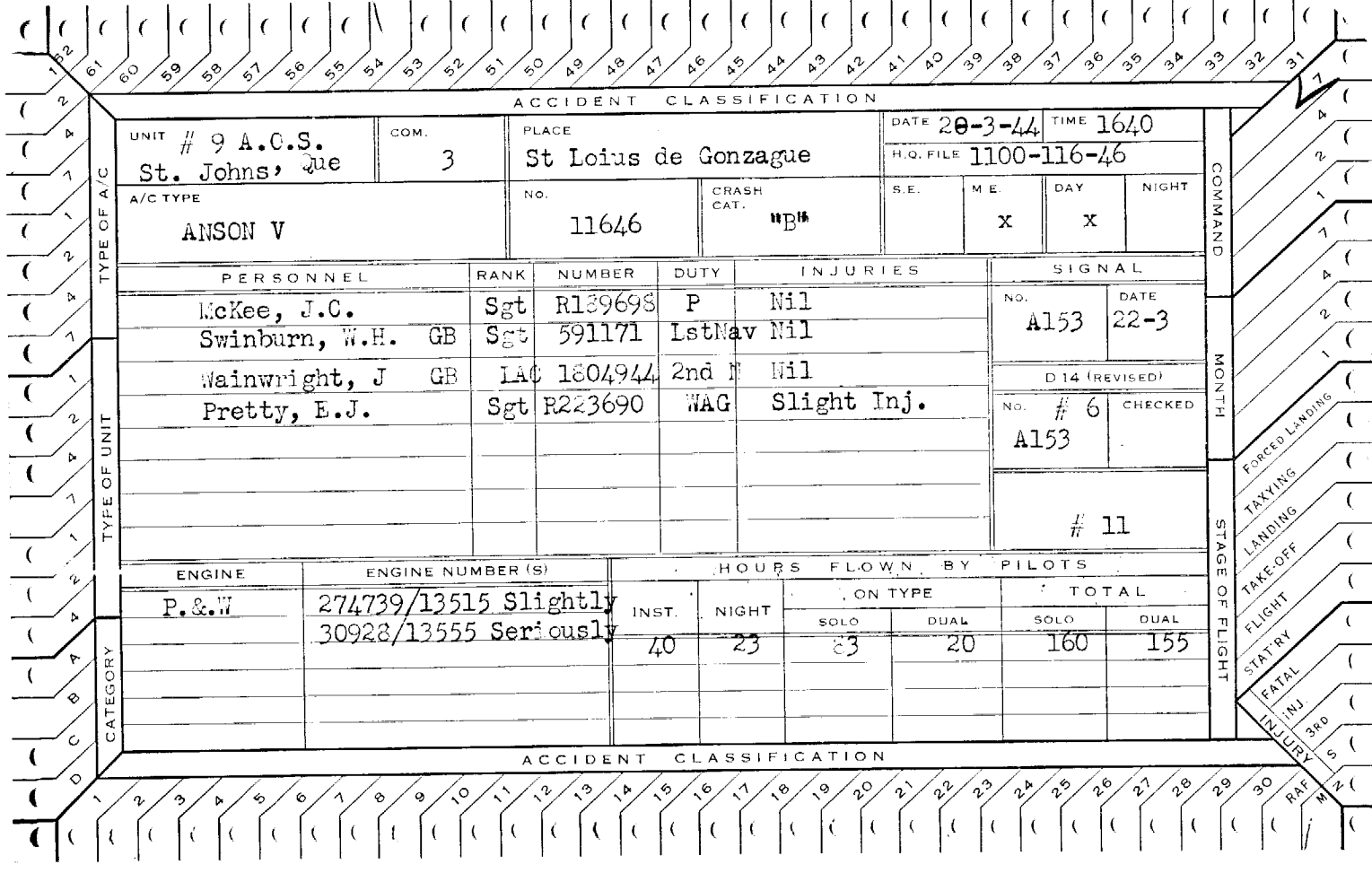

ACCIDENT CLASSIFICATION



PURPOSE OF FLIGHT:

Routine day navigation exercises.

NATURE OF ACCIDENT:

Right engine failed at 600<sup>m</sup> during low level nav. exercises. Pilot saw heavy smoke coming from right engine, shut off gas and switches and pulled fire extinguisher handle. Excessive vibration set up in a/c and pilot states he was losing height so carried out forced landing. Pilot reports normal engine and engine controls used normally before failure.

A. Engine failure in the air.
