PURPOSE OF FLIGHT:

Local flying practice.

NATURE OF ACCIDENT:

Being a steep turn at 3000' my plane stalled and flicked. I banged my head against the head. I lost consciousness until I found myself very near the ground in a dive I pulled back the stick but went straight in.

COURT OF INQUIRY OR INVESTIGATING OFFICER'S REPORT:

SUMMARY No. 2454

CAUSE: Too tight a turn which resulted in a flick and the student was stunned, thereby losing control.

RECOMMENDATIONS: Safety harness should be good and tight and not loosened under any circumstances when doing steep turns, aerobatics, etc. This should be stressed strongly by instructors.

REMARKS OF C.O.: This pilot will be checked and watched carefully.

CONCLUSIONS OF A.I.B.: In the light of subsequent medical examination of this pupil the accident may be said to have been caused by loss of control resulting from physical incapacity.

NOTE: Sub.Lt. Anderson was subjected to tests in the centrifuge at No. 1 C.I.U. and it was found, "this pupil passed out cold at 3 1/2 "G" with convulsions. After a few days' rest

ACTION TAKEN: he was again tested and became unconscious at 3 1/2 "G" for NO. 2; see Summary No. 2454.
