There is so much we would like to have known or as best your son that we would very much like to have met him before he left Eng. for Canada but we couldn't find out any thing I wonder would we be asking too much. Could he tell us what he knows and if he thinks there is still hope we would both be very grateful for any news he might give us.

We have waited so long now, that we would like to know, any thing it is possible to know, & would it be asking, too much, we were wondering if the two poor boys who were found dead went down with the plane.

Two Warrens ^{had} Clark Wilson, and said what a fine looking boy he was, she was to have met ^{whole} crew at Easter but, unfortunately it couldn't be.
